#### Stabilisation and resilience

Mr. Bryld has worked in fragile and conflict affected areas since 2001, focusing on stabilisation, resilience as well as engagement sin the humanitarian-development-peace nexus. Assignments have included contextual analyses, identification, formulation and evaluations of donor strategies, resilience programmes, refugee and IDP related interventions, and conflict resolution processes.
